Mel introduced guest speaker CPT Jonathan Hunter (Army), a West Point graduate who has served ten years as of this date. He spoke of the Clemson ROTC Program which currently has one hundred fifty cadets; thirty percent are women. Clemson has never had a recruiting problem.

The second guest speaker to be introduced was Air Force Col Chris Kiser. Col Kiser has served twenty-three years, flew C130s with 2,200 flight hours with over 200 combat hours. Clemson AF

ROTC currently has about 140 cadets; fifty percent are female. There are 28 cadets in this year's senior class. All are expected to be commissioned into the Air Force at graduation which exceeds the national average. He said, we are "right where we need to be".

Janelle introduced cadets Murray and Hoffman.

Cadet John Murray (a Clemson Senior) is from Marietta, GA. He aspires to become a Medical Service Officer with the Army.

Cadet Sophie Hoffmann (Air Force ROTC at Clemson) is from Maryland. She aspires to follow in her father's footsteps and become an Air Force doctor.

Greenville Chapter Update: Several Board Members have been working hard to reconstitute the Greenville Chapter. The Piedmont Chapter is the sponsoring organization and will hold the organizational meeting for a new Greenville Chapter on 10 October.

JROTC Update: Within the next several weeks, we will host 2 luncheon roundtable discussions for JROTC leaders.

M. J. Dolly Cooper Veterans Cemetery: A couple of our Piedmont Board members have been successful helping to influence the state legislature to provide almost one million dollars to fund improvements at our veterans' cemetery.
